

## Blessed are the Caregivers

Recently, I have talked with several people who are caregivers for Alzheimer's and other dementia patients. It is probably the hardest illness to cope with–especially for the caregiver.

In 2005, my mother was diagnosed with Alzheimer's. As the oldest of five children and the only one retired at the time, it fell on me to be the caregiver. The first symptoms were alarming: she would call me, especially around dusk almost every day, and tell me that her house was full of people and she didn't even have a place to sit down. Shortly afterward, she asked me to take her checkbook and start paying her bills, because she was having trouble keeping it up. Then I noticed that when I took her to the senior center to play Bingo, she couldn't seem to make the connection with the numbers being called. I knew I needed to take her to her doctor, so I sat down and wrote him a letter prior to her appointment, apprising him of her various symptoms. After he examined her, he gave me the form to check out, and I saw the diagnosis of "Alzheimer's" written on it.

Nothing about the next three years was easy. I knew not to argue with anything she said, no matter how wrong. I just went along; she would forget momentarily anyway. I tried not to let it bother me when she didn't recognize me or the cat.

It was physically and mentally exhausting, and I was so grateful for the trips my sisters made to give me short breaks. I hired a local woman to sit with Mama so I could go to church and do a few other things. I was teaching an adult Bible class at the time, and doing the hours of research each week was therapeutic.

Looking back, I know I should have done better. But I also know Mama is happier now in Heaven with Daddy. She has forgiven me for not hugging her enough.

May God bless all of you caregivers with strength, patience and compassion.


