Junior Division: Elifah Pyle from St. John Lutheran School for his Environmental Engineering project "What blade ends are most efficient for water design?"



Fear Not

President Franklin D. Roosevelt, in his 1933 inaugural address, was attempting to bolster a nation that had just endured several years of a great depression when he stated the memorable words, "The only thing we have to fear is fear itself." What do you fear? Another depression? Bad health? Or maybe a third-world war?

A while back, I was speaking to a female friend and confessed that a recent night of severe pain had scared me so much that I was afraid of having to be hospitalized. As I sat up in the middle of the night, unable to sleep, I was reminded of a verse from Paul's second epistle to Timothy, in which he asserts that "God has not given us a spirit of fear, but of power, and of love, and of a sound mind." At that moment, I felt my fear start to subside because of that scripture's reassurance.

My friend asked me to give her the exact scripture because she had fears of her own. It surprised me to learn that this woman, who always seemed so happy and in love with life, could actually harbor worries. She didn't say what they were, and I didn't ask, but I advised her to read and memorize 2 Timothy 1:7.

Some of the greatest Biblical heroes faced fear. Moses feared his inability to speak in public and lead the Israelites to freedom. In fact, several times during the forty years in the wilderness, God told him to "fear not" and reminded him of the many times He had brought them through perilous situations.

King David also had experiences with fear. But by confessing to God and trusting in Him, he was able to give us that reassuring verse from the 23rd Psalm: "Yeah, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil, for Thou art with me."

Maybe it is time to assert your faith and ask God to take away whatever fear is preventing you from moving forward. Claim God's promises to Moses, David, and others as your own.

What the FY 2024 NDAA Means for Your TRICARE Benefit

MOAA's work to preserve your service-earned health care benefit received support from several key provisions in the FY 2024 National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA), which became law last month.

Here's a look at some of the key details from the new law. Keep up with all of MOAA's ongoing health care advocacy work via our Advocacy News page.

TRICARE Pharmacy Network Report

Senate report language connected to the NDAA directed the Government Accountability Office (GAO) to assess the impact of TRICARE retail pharmacy network cuts on beneficiaries. Specifically, an upcoming report will examine the effects of the cuts on rural families, compound medication access, long-term care residents, and patients with chronic medical conditions.

MOAA is scheduled to meet with GAO staffers to provide beneficiary insights, including feedback shared by MOAA members via our online reporting tool. Securing the GAO report was a top priority for MOAA and will propel the next phase of our advocacy efforts on this issue.

What is next?

MOAA will continue its work on health care issues not included in the FY 2024 defense authorization bill, including parity for TRICARE young adults and an expanded dental benefit for reserve component servicemembers. These efforts will coincide with broader priorities such as access to care, risks to TRICARE networks, and protecting TRICARE For Life. Reach out to your lawmaker on these issues and others by registering today at MOAA's Legislative Action Center.


